

### FY 2009 Finance Update

- New grant program firmly established with over 100 projects in Capital Pipeline
  - Over \$50M in grants paid out to new program projects in FY '09
- \$375M in grants paid out through Prior Grants program in FY '09
- \$290M in grants paid out to expedited Waiting List projects in FY '09
- SMART Fund sales tax revenue collections are estimated to be as much as \$120M below the \$702M statutory floor for FY '09
- Authority's administrative budget remains disciplined
  - 10% favorable variance to FY '09 Board Approved Budget

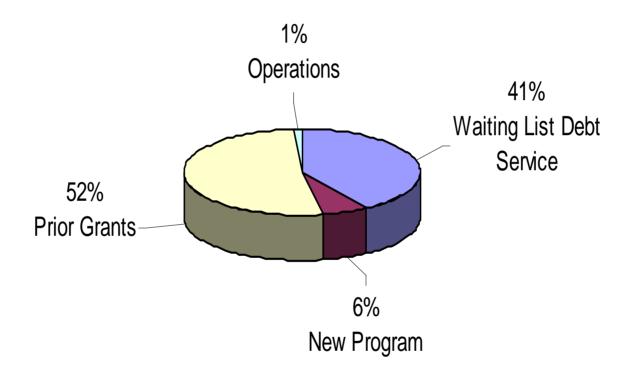

### FY 2009 Spending Update - Significant Variances

- Total Administrative Expense Budget 10% below Board Approved authorization
  - \$606K less in Board Approved Salaries & Benefits due to deceleration of anticipated hires
  - Slight increase in FY2009 (\$91K) in one-time Consulting & Professional Support Services driven by:
    - Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB) Actuarial Study
    - Construction Induced Enrollment Study one-time cost
  - The MSBA did not have need to expend the Cost of Issuance item in FY2009 because no debt was issued, but issuance will be necessary in FY2010.
  - Capital Program Professional Support Services (e.g. cost estimating, outside audit firms, architectural services) was accessed less than anticipated
    - With exception of outside audit firms, these services will become more necessary as projects continue to progress into and through the MSBA Capital Pipeline
    - Outside audit firm utilization will continue to decrease as Waiting List and Prior Grant projects receive final audits
    - Slower staff hiring decelerated the ability to retain and manage outside vendors in FY2009. Additional assistance from outside vendors will be necessary in FY2010

# FY 2010 – Upcoming Issues

- Commonwealth's FY 2010 Budget requires MSBA to transfer \$150M to Commonwealth
- Commercial Paper Renewal Decision
- RFQ for Investment Banking Services
- Long-Term Debt Issuance
  - Qualified School Construction Bonds
  - Qualified School Construction Bonds Charter Schools Allocation

### MA Annual Operating Budget – MSBA Impact

- \$150M transfer from MSBA to Commonwealth
- Commonwealth designates MSBA as entity with authorization to issue Qualified School Construction Bonds (\$288M total for FY '09 & FY '10)
- Reimbursement Rate Point changes
  - Elimination of 40% floor in MSBA reimbursement rate calculation
  - Capping Total Incentive Points awarded by the MSBA at 18%
  - Capping any individual category of Incentive Points at 6%
  - Eliminated categories of ill-defined Incentive Points that were never awarded

### FY 2010 Revenue Assumptions

- MSBA's Statutory Floor Sunsets at Year End FY'09 (\$702M for FY2'09)
  - FY2010 SMART Fund receives 95% of Dedicated Sales Tax Revenue (DSTR)
  - FY2011 and thereafter, SMART Fund receives 100% of Dedicated Sales Tax Revenues (DSTR)
- SMART Fund collections for FY2010 are estimated to be \$612M
- Sales Tax Base Changes: SMART Fund will benefit from expanded Sales Tax Base
  - Elimination of exemption from Sales Tax for alcohol = +\$12M BUT.....
- Sales Tax Rate Changes: SMART Fund is expected to lose -\$7M as a result of the increase in the Sales Tax RATE to 6.25%
- MSBA required to transfer \$150M to Commonwealth

### MSBA Finance Overview Summary

- On a cash basis, the \$150M transfer to the Commonwealth results in a temporary & short-term structural imbalance based on anticipated revenue collections
  - Issuance of up to \$288M in QSCBs will help alleviate the short-term imbalance
    - Anticipated issuance of interest-free QSCBs will help cash flow, but will replace unrestricted MSBA funds with restrictive QSCB bond proceeds
      - Strict spend-down requirements and eligible cost rules
      - Must be repaid at maturity
    - Market for QSCBs is still developing

<sup>\*</sup> The MSBA has been designated as the authorized issuer of the Commonwealth's allocation of QSCBs. This designation creates a potential opportunity for the MSBA to issue up to \$288M in debt that will have an approximate maturity of 15 years. While the MSBA may issue \$288M in debt to offset the \$150M contribution to the Commonwealth, it is also necessary for the MSBA to repay the \$288M at maturity. The net present value of the \$288M in today's dollars, 15 years from now, is approximately \$150M. The ability to issue the QSCBs will enable the MSBA to offset the Authority's net loss anticipated in FY2010.

### Sustainable Building Design

# MSBA continues to research and review sustainable design for school buildings:

- Conversations are being held with Districts and their designers for projects in MSBA capital pipeline;
- An informational meeting was held with the Boston Society of Architects;
- RFR for a sustainable consultant issued and responses due July 30.
- Ongoing discussions with MTC and representatives from CHPS – National.

### Sustainable Building Design

- MSBA research and review indicates:
  - There is the opportunity for Massachusetts designers to work directly with CHPS - National similar to the third party verification approach utilized in the LEED process by USGBC.
  - Thereby, verification through either MA-CHPS or LEED becomes available offering flexibility to the Districts and the designers to accomplish the sustainable goal and to become eligible for incentive points.

# Sustainable Building Design

### What's next?

- Establish a point-by-point comparison of MA-CHPS and LEED for schools to develop equivalent scorecards and levels of performance.
  - Properly identify the prerequisite criteria in both systems especially as required by Massachusetts building code
  - Outline the criteria for a "base" design for a MSBA-funded school project
  - Distinguish the important criteria from each scorecard (MA-CHPS and LEED) necessary to achieve eligibility for MSBA incentive points
- Evaluate and determine any adjustments necessary to the current gradation of available incentive points.
- Focus on sustainable policy issues impacting Massachusetts school buildings and operational budgets.

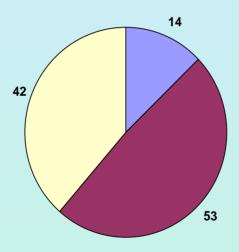
# MSBA Tools & Processes to Support Districts

### **Local Vote Authorization**

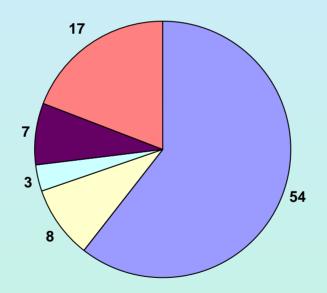

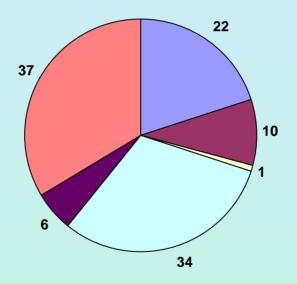

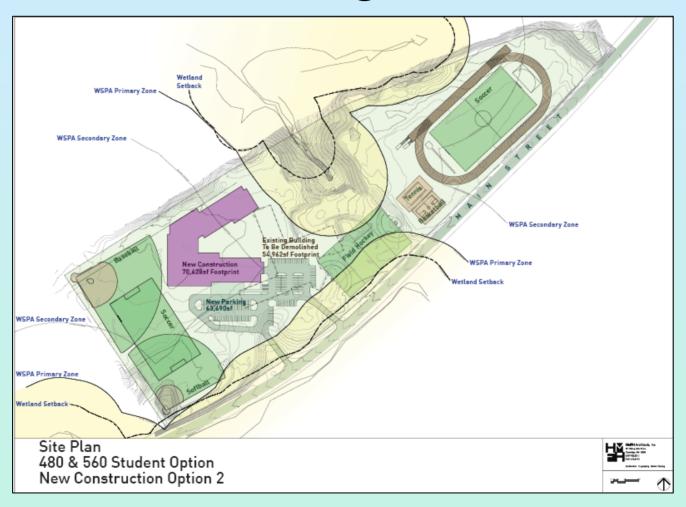

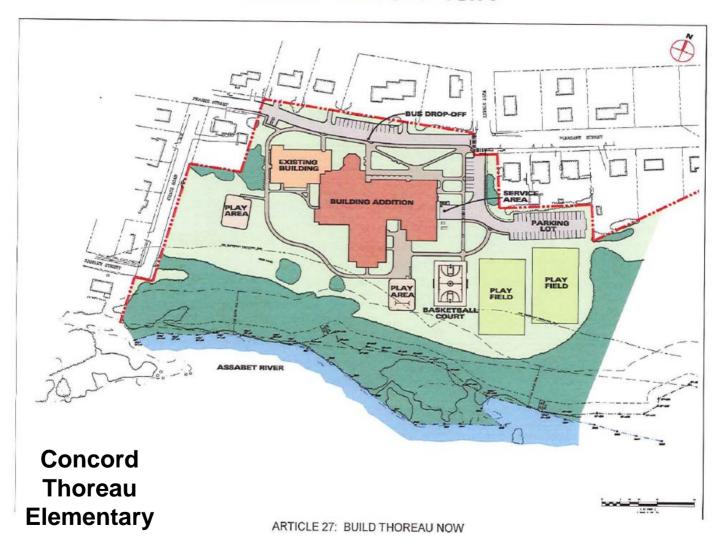
