Discussion

MSBA staff reviewed the documents provided by the District and met with the District and its consultants to discuss scope and budget. The District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$175,997,289, which includes an estimated construction budget of \$140,773,848 (\$433/sq. ft.). The Estimated Basis of Total Facilities Grant would be \$126,890,970, which excludes ineligible Feasibility Study costs associated with site procurement studies, legal fees, OPM fees in excess of 3.5% of construction costs, Designer fees in excess of 10% of construction costs, ineligible costs associated with abatement of asbestos-containing floor materials and contaminated soils, site costs in excess of 8% of total building cost, construction costs in excess of \$299/sq. ft. plus eligible demolition and abatement, costs associated with mailing and moving, costs associated with ineligible construction area and related commissioning fees, costs in excess of the MSBA Fixtures, Furniture and Equipment cost caps, and owner's and construction contingency costs.

The MSBA has calculated a total of \$187,665 for recovery of funds associated with two items:

- The proposed demolition of the existing Billerica Memorial High School will result in the MSBA recovering a portion of state funds previously paid to the District for a window replacement project at the existing facility, which was completed in 2011. The MSBA has calculated this recovery of funds to be \$179,292 and this amount has been deducted from the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant and the Maximum Total Facilities Grant.
- The proposed project includes 10,734 square feet of area that is ineligible for reimbursement. For this reason, the MSBA will be recovering the associated commissioning costs, including space associated with BEAM (a community based organization that provides support for at-risk families), a referee's room, district offices, and a school concessions space. The MSBA has calculated this recovery of funds to be \$8,373 and this amount has also been deducted from the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant and the Maximum Total Facilities Grant.

MSBA staff recommends an Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant of \$72,127,499; however, the District may be eligible for up to an additional \$1,549,678 in grant funds, subject to the MSBA's review and audit of the owner's and construction contingency expenditures. Accordingly, MSBA staff recommends a Maximum Total Facilities Grant of \$73,677,177 for the Project Scope and Budget Agreement and Project Funding Agreement to replace the existing Billerica Memorial High School on the existing site.

² Does not include any grant funds for potentially eligible owner's or construction contingency expenditures; subject to MSBA review and audit.

³ Includes maximum possible owner's and construction contingency grant funds, the final amount of which, if any, shall be determined by the MSBA in its sole discretion. The MSBA does not anticipate that the District will expend all of its contingency funds on expenses that are eligible for MSBA reimbursement.
