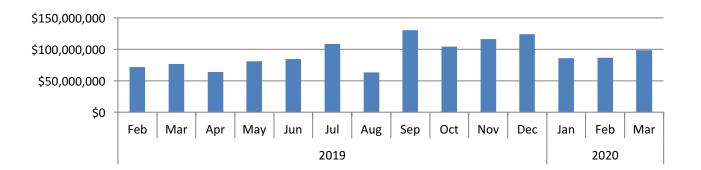

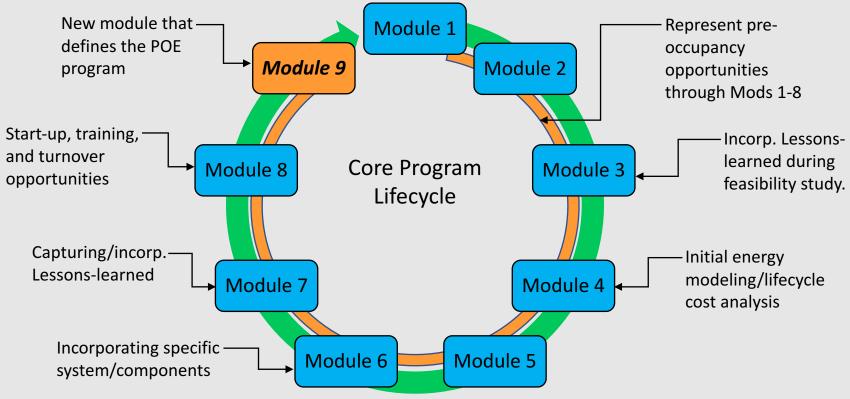

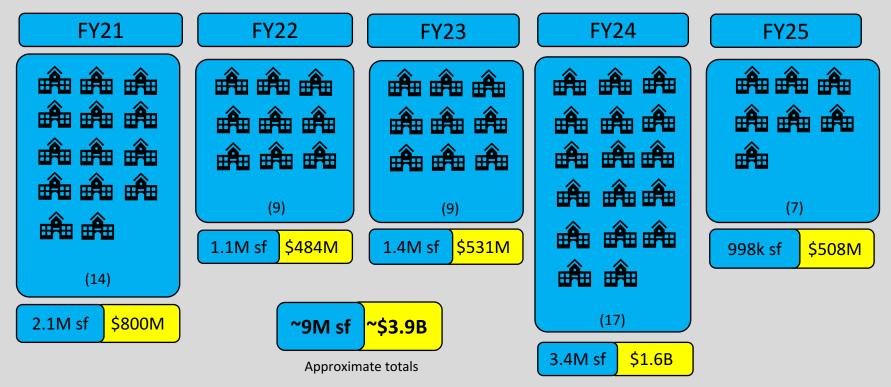

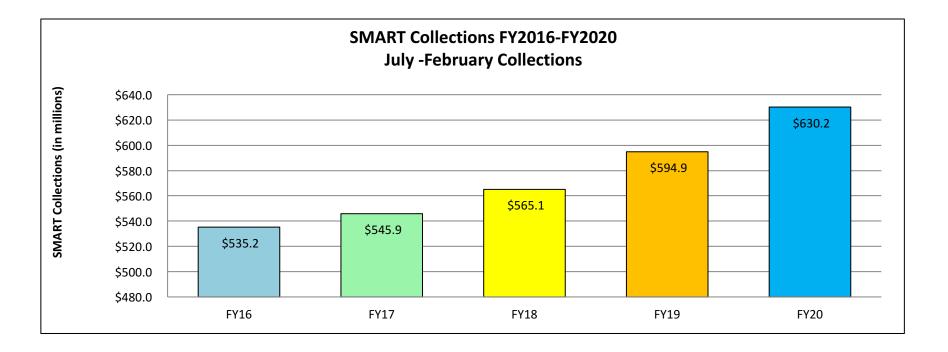
- FY 2020 Consensus Revenue Estimate of \$954 million would represent growth of 6.8% over the FY 19 unaudited amount
- FY 2020 collections for July 2019 thru February 2020 are \$35,380 million (5.95%) higher than FY2019 collections for the same period

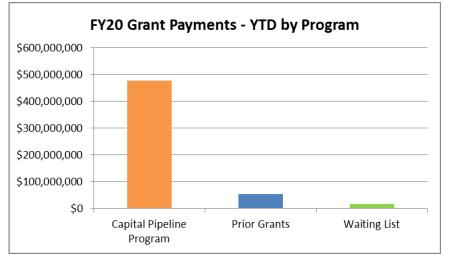

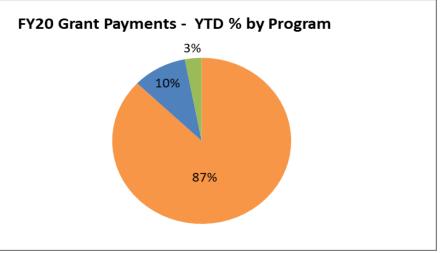

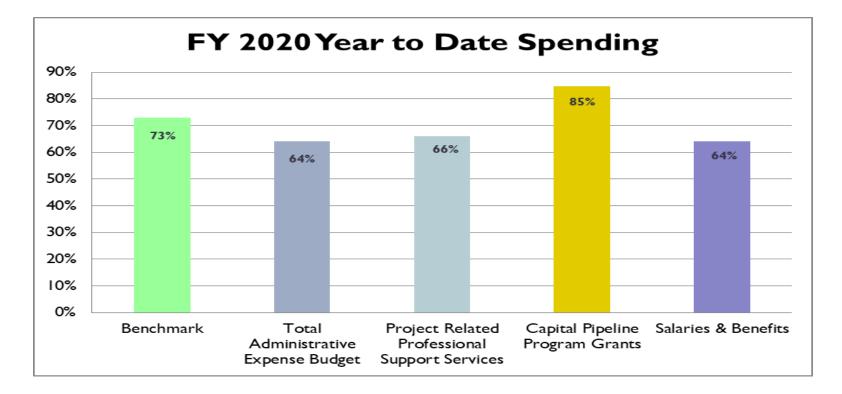

## Transactions: March 2020

#### Restructuring of Escrow Agreement; May 2018 Defeasance

- 2012A and 2016B Bonds
  - Replaced 0% SLGS with interest earning SLGS
    - Approximately \$242,000 Released to MSBA

#### \$150M Defeasance of 2012A, 2012B and 2015B Bonds

- MSBA Goal of Bonds in High Debt Service Years
- Defeasance of 2015B Bonds Reduced \$2M Rebate due in February 2020 by \$300,000; now due in December 2020
  - Eliminated approximately \$3M Rebate Payment due in 2025

#### Termination of GIC with FSA; 2012A and 2012B Refunding Bonds

- \$200M Principal DSRF; \$78.6M Premium to MSBA
